In between conducting business on the second day of the 2012 VVA convention, in Reno Nevada, VVA National President John Rowan went to the microphone in the plenary session to announce the VVA Member of the Year. As he began to read from the winning nomination, I recognized the words, "Since 1988, he has been the editor of his chapter's outstanding chapter newsletter, which circulates to a broader community, including local, state and federal elected officials, the Department of Veteran Affairs and beyond. THE WALL HEALS "ALL"

On March 16, 2011, Bill Shugarts and Ben Buckley waited for the arrival of the Lyons PTSD Class at The Wall on a clear spring morning. Two Asian looking businessmen with roses approached them. They appeared to be looking for a name on The Wall. Bill, who serves as a National Park Service Volunteer at The Wall took the initiative and asked if he could be of assistance. One said that he simply came to pay his respects to the fallen soldiers. Bill noticed that the man spoke with a Vietnamese accent and he asked if the visitor had served in the war. The man answered "yes". Bill asked "what ARVN unit that he served." The man politely answered, "I served in the North Vietnamese army."

After the initial shock, Bill and Ben quickly developed a bond with their former adversary. The three veterans understood the real cost of a war, the loss of loved ones and close friends, and the elusive answer, "Why?" Like most of us, the visitor was a draftee that fought against American and ARVN units. Ben served as an infantry company commander in Vietnam, and Bill served in a transpiration unit that supplied

Americal Division forward base camps. Bill, who has visited Vietnam after the war as a businessman, is amazed how open the people are about the war and their willingness to heal their war losses. The Vietnamese people especially the younger ones, have a high regard for us and want to build a strong relationship with us. . After placing roses at The Wall, the veterans departed as friends. Thanks to email, Bill maintains contact with the veterans.

Later, Bill had a second encounter with a former enemy, a VC soldier, with similar results. From these two visits, it appears that The Wall provides the opportunity for both adversaries to heal our war wounds and to develop a lasting friendship.

On May 13, Dave Sciacchitano and Len Ignatowski welcomed the AP American History class from The Epiphany School in New Bern, North Carolina and their teacher, Raelenne Haeberle. She requested our presence to share our thoughts on the war and to answer any questions. Her stepfather, Marty Rufh, is an air force Vietnam veteran. The students were on a D.C. visit. Dave served in an air force tactical support unit, while Len served with an army engineering unit.

The visit was a chapter first in that it was done in the late evening quietness and fading light at The Wall, which added a unique relevance. The visit included The Wall, The Women's Memorial, and the Three Soldiers statue.

Len started his discussion on The Wall's history by asking the students to find Eugene Toni's name on Panel 7W because Eugene had asked Len if his name had been removed. The students were stunned by the request, but Len quickly added that Eugene and several other names were

inscribed on The Wall by mistake. Several students had grandfathers or family that served in Vietnam, but none talked about it. The group expressed their gratitude for sharing our Tours of Duty, and some young ladies with tears in their eyes hugged the two veterans as they were leaving. Thanks Dave for arranging the meeting.

NATIONAL CONVENTION

Bruce Waxman, Len Ignatowski, Bill Dumsick, and Paul Stancliff represented the chapter at the recent VVA National Convention in Reno, Nevada. The convention excitement centered on the races for president, vice president, treasurer, and secretary. A runoff vote was needed to determine the secretary's position. 


